# **Presidents' Report (7:02 - 7:10)**

- Kindness Week + Upcoming Events -- So many wonderful things happening this week!
  - A Little Library is now open in the lobby of the school. Open from 7:30 3:30 each day so you or your child can come in and pick up a book or drop off some of their own favorites to be included
  - Bring home-baked **cookies to the Food Drive** for our families (this week only)
  - An alumnus and his dad built and donated 10 desks for our students who didn't have workspaces at home. We know that there are many more students who would benefit from having a desk -- there are kids working in closets, or even their bathrooms, in an effort to get a little space of their own. Anne Pejovich has polled the teachers and there's a need for about 20 more desks, which would be \$1000. PTA vote approved almost unanimously the \$1000 to fund the additional desks

- Return to school on 2/25!!
  - Will host a town hall dedicated solely to Return to School
  - Schedule will not be completely overhauled
  - Planning to consolidate sections (going to create full sections)

- No teacher changes
- Most of the teachers have the vaccine; many have the second dose
- Hoping to put all the 6th graders on the same time schedule and add a period of the day for all 6th graders. Adding in-person music and/or art
- Kids who are 100% remote can Zoom into the room so they can follow the lesson in the classroom. Will be able to hear but not interact
- o Bringing in some students 5 days a week who need quiet, safe, stable place to work
- 73% of students are coming into the building

- Diversity generates benefits for all learners respect, empathy, exposure to people different than ourselves improve cognitive thinking

- PTA Resources are Highly Unequal
  - Typical white student as \$65/student (more than double than typical Asian and only 1/10 for Black/Hispanic)

  - Opportunity for our school viewed as a positive

# Guest Speaker: <u>Justine Fonte</u>, Intersectional Health Educator (7:30 - 8:30)

Justine Ang Fonte is the Director of Health & Wellness at The Dalton School and is a sexuality educator, consultant, and speaker on intersectional health and sex education for teachers, parents, and students in both public and private institutions across the United States.

She received her Master's in Education from the University of Hawai`i and her Master's in Public Health from Columbia University.

- Links will be shared with resources for those not present at the PTA
- Use them to teach/reinforce with your kids at home
- Parent Sex Ed 101
  - Goal safety, fulfillment, pleasure
  - Promoting kids to make good decisions slowly building a good foundation for the future in age appropriate ways
- There are three topics
  - Body Agency they have a say in who makes them comfortable. Understand your body and your body
  - Identities others identify me in the same way as I see myself. Understand the spectrum of identities
  - Healthy relationships biggest and most in demand topic. Promote consent culture! Anyone can change their mind at any time. Just because someone hasn't said NO doesn't mean they have given consent (if drink/under influence not able to legally give consent). Amaze.org videos are a good resource. Intimacy is not the same as intercouse (pleasure based/intimacy building blocks delay sex, lower STI, etc.). Consent education the platinum rule --- treat others the way others want to be treated (not everyone wants).

the same thing!). This rule promotes communication! Check out the Al Vernaccho Ted Talk! Use the pizza metaphor (hunger - what do you want??) versus the baseball metaphor (two teams in opposition; someone wins)

- How is online presence starting to suggest things and be literate?
- Will be talking about relationships with the kids in the Spring at Booker T (topic 3)
- Barriers: most kids about about 3-6 years behind basic sex ed benchmarks so sex educators are constantly doing remedial work. This is a health & wellness topic!
- This should be an ongoing topics in age appropriate ways
- Sexual violence can be prevented by education
- Want our kids to have a <u>sex positive</u> definition of sexuality
- Barriers to the goals: stigma (sex negative approach), anxiety, misinformation (media, porn, social media, celebrities, etc), gendered expectations (toxic masculinity, heteronormativty, etc)
- How do we tackle parents are the top sex educators (parent involvement in child schooling, and connectedness to parents). Sex ed at home, and at school. Don't think about "the talk" (1 one hundred minute talk); think about 100 one minute talks. Watch tv/news and talk about others situations- easier!
- Porn literacy. Your kids might stumble on this online. Teach them that porn is complete fantasy and doesn't show realistic healthy relationships!
- 4 steps for answering your kids questions
  - Validate the question that's a great question
  - Get a baseline of their knowledge (what have you heard) so you can give a response just above their level of knowledge (reference on how advanced their knowledge is)
  - Answer the question honestly, provide medically factual information. Or say you don't know if you don't
  - Follow up does that answer your question?
- The last thing we want is for them to fear
- You can also start conversations if they don't initiative
  - o How did that news story make you feel?
  - What does non-binary actually mean? Teach me
  - When do you think sex ed should be taught?
  - Whoa what were those song lyrics?
- Speaker offered a few book recomendations (sex is a funny word; scarlet teen; puberty for girls; period). Kids gravitate to websites (sex etctera; Amaze.org; our bodies ourselves). Newest favorite book is called "Sex positive families". Book/website list will be available
- Check out the speaker's website for resources and videos
