

## **Guest Speaker - DR. ERIKA ROONEY**

Dr. Erika Rooney from the Child Mind Institute discussion of MINDFUL PARENTING.

- Dr. Rooney's workshop gave an overview of what Mindful Parenting is, summarized research on mindfulness strategies and their role in promoting mental health, and shared practical advice on how to incorporate mindfulness into our daily lives. She gave guidance on how to teach mindfulness exercises to our children and left us a one sheet on this powerful coping tool so that we have a resource Key points:
- Lots of myths about mindfulness
- What is mindfulness? Life life with awareness of exactly what is happening in the present; increase focus; be present in the moment; non judgmentally
- Benefits for parents and kids in control of your mind; choose behavior more thoughtfully; see
  reality; focus attention; increase compassion and empathy; non-judgmental experience of self;
  self-awareness and self-regulation; managing intense emotions; reduced anxiety/stress/emotional
  distress: increased resilience.
- Practical strategies "How to Skills" (cheat sheet)
  - 5 Tips: 1) Be fully in the moment; 2) Remain in the moment; 3) Acknowledge non related thoughts and let them go; 4) Observe and describe instead of judging; and 5) Use five senses within the experience
  - Breathing is a great strategy to focus
  - Schedule time to just be with your kids with no agenda in mind (connect in simple moments)
  - o Give yourself permission to take time to reset if you are feeling uncentered
  - Practice compassion
  - Encourage your kids but speak to them in their language

- 356 offers made to new students for 6th grade
- Meeting with parents recently on what kids will need next year (ideas will be shared with SLT)
- Met with 7th graders to share their ideas about next year as well. Theme: we're tired of zoom and we want to come back full time in person
- Superintendent from D3 interested in coming to PTA elected officials are taking note of parent advocacy. Will hopefully come to a future PTA

## Treasurer's Report (8:20 - 8:35)

- Budget Update
  - Net Income: \$92k v. \$11k budgeted
- Grant Status
  - 2 grants in review with the city \$60 for band room renovations and \$30k for replenishing the 6th grade instruments. Expect to hear in June. Received previously approved grants -\$300K for AC and \$300k for band room so those projects can kick off!
  - Yard is on schedule to be done by the start of the upcoming school year. Ann Pejovic is on point following up with the parks department
- 2021-22 Budget Proposed budget: \$390k income; \$697k expenses for a net income of negative (\$307k). PTA currently has ~\$800k in the bank. PTA typically budgets a loss but historically has not ever ended at a loss. Budget will be re-voted in the Fall if it needs to be adjusted (and also if needed throughout the year). Approved 100%; Abstained 0%
